## Rules and Regulations of the Association for Self-Government of the Students of Jackson College

### I. LEAVE OF ABSENCE

(a) All absences must be recorded in the proctor's book.

(b) Freshmen and Sophomores are not allowed to attend dances "off the Hill."

### II. CALLERS

(a) During term-time on all evenings, except Tuesday and days of the "All Around Club" meetings, upper-class students may receive callers from 3 to 6 P.M. and 8 to 9.50 P.M.

(b) Freshman and Sophomores will not entertain callers more than twice in the week.

(c) Between Class Day and Commencement Day, no undergraduates are permitted to receive calls.

### III. CHAPERONAGE

(a) Students must not be away from the Hill unchaperoned after 8 o'clock.

(b) All entertainments, excursions, and drives in the evening must be chaperoned.

(c) No girl, unchaperoned, may be with an escort away from the Dormitory after 6.30 in the evening, without permission from the Dean. After May 15 the time will be extended to 7.30.

(d) If, in any case, the chaperon be an unmarried woman, the Dean's approval is necessary.

### IV. ENTERTAINMENTS

(a) Visitors at the Halls are under Student Government rules and, without special permission, will not remain more than two nights in succession.

(b) For entertaining in their own rooms the men of their immediate family, girls may obtain permission of the proctors.

## V. BOUNDS AND HOURS

(a) The boundaries of the Hill, as referred to in these rules, are Sawyer Avenue, Curtis Street as far as Capen Street, Talbot Avenue, and College Avenue as far as the Post Office.

(b) Quiet hours shall be maintained from 10 to 12 in the morning and from 2 to 4 in the afternoon. On Saturday afternoons and Sundays this rule is not in force. On Sundays, however, no ragtime or other so-called popular music is to be played on the pianos.

(c) Quiet must be maintained after 10 P.M. This rule *alone* will be suspended during vacations and holidays. Any who have permission to attend evening entertainments are requested to be considerate of the others on their return.
