- The opinion research projects just completed (five focus groups and n=300 poll of smokers who fly in the San Francisco area) have raised the following questions:
 - o <u>Among nonsmokers</u>: Is there a strong preference for a "total ban" airline on longer flights or does it not matter that much to them?
 - o Among smokers:

How does the two year sunset provision make them feel about the two hour ban? What will they do in the fight for reversal?

Will they fight to stop a "total ban"?

Will they vote against a Congressman who supports a total ban?

Will they not fly a total ban airline on longer flights?

Will they fight a ban on terminal waiting area smoking?

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> Are they mad enough at Northwest for going beyond the federal law that they will be less likely to fly the airline?

- 2. To quantify these questions, I'd suggest a national random sample of the flying public (taken a flight in the last year -- roughly 50% of all adults). A 1000 person sample would yield roughly n=750 nonsmokers and _ n=250 smokers.
- 3. Each group would be asked separate questionnaires with the nonsmoker questions lasting five to seven minutes and the smokers 10 to 12 minutes. (SEE ATTACHED PROPOSED QUESTIONS)
- 4. The objectives of this survey project are . . .
 - o To provide strategic input to the effort to reverse the federal two hour ban.
 - To demonstrate the level of potential lost business among smokers by airlines who enforce a total ban.
 - To demonstrate the lack of a competitive advantage among nonsmokers and the potential of a smoker backlash for airlines instituting a total ban.
- 5. The fee for this survey of 1000 Americans who have flown in the past year is \$28,500.
