

purpose is more ambitious than merely providing us with a new look at the Cold War. Exploring the ideological origins of American policy, Yergin suggests, can cast light on all of postwar U.S. foreign policy, from the Vietnam War to the current debate on detente.

This well-written, exhaustively researched book is a stimulating, sometimes controversial look at what Dr. Yergin calls "the story of the origins of our own time." It deserves the attention of all who are interested in contemporary American foreign policy.
