To amend the Federal Aviation Act of 1958 to prohibit smoking on domestic commercial aircraft flights.

Mr. OBERSTAR introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Public Works and Transportation

A-BILL

To amend the Federal Aviation Act of 1958 to prohibit smoking on domestic commercial aircraft flights.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Aircraft Cabin Air Qual-
- 5 ity Protection Act of 1989".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

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- 7 The Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) The Surgeon General's report entitled "The
- 9 Health Consequences of Smoking: Chronic Obstructive
- 10 Lung Disease", issued in 1984, reported that passive

1	smoking and the accompanying high levels of indoor
2	air pollution pose a variety of long-term health risks to
3	passengers on aircraft, where airflow is severely re-
4	stricted.
5	(2) In 1986, the following 3 reports bearing on
6	the health risks of smoking aboard commercial aircraft
7	have been issued:
8	(A) The report of the National Academy of
9	Sciences entitled "The Airliner Cabin Environ-
10	ment: Air Quality and Safety", issued in August
11	1986, which recommended that for health and
12	safety reasons all smoking should be prohibited on
13	domestic commercial aircraft flights.
14	(B) The report of the National Academy of
15 ·	Sciences entitled "Environmental Tobacco
16	Smoke: Measuring Exposures and Assessing
17	Health Effects", issued in November 1986, which
18	provided scientific evidence of the health risks
19	posed to nonsmokers on aircraft when smoking is
20	permitted anywhere in the passenger cabin.
21	(C) The report of the study conducted by the
22	Surgeon General regarding involuntary smoking,
23	issued in December 1986, which provided addi-
24	tional evidence of the dangers of environmental

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tobacco smoke.

- 1 (3) Involuntary smoking is a cause of disease, in-2 cluding lung cancer, in healthy nonsmokers.
 - (4) Nonsmokers are entitled to a smoke-free environment. The National Academy of Sciences has found that the separation of smokers and nonsmokers in separate sections on aircraft does not prevent smoke exposure for all passengers and all flight attendants.
 - (5) The relatively low humidity aboard aircraft, combined with the reduced fresh air flow on aircraft, aggravates passenger discomfort and irritation when air quality contaminants are present. Especially sensitive persons, such as asthmatics or those with allergies, may experience extreme discomfort from and severe reactions to tobacco smoke exposure in the aircraft cabin environment. These short-term health risks and the long-term health risks described in this section are particularly high for members of flight crews, who are constantly exposed to these contaminants in their workplace.
- 20 SEC. 3. PROHIBITION BY AIR CARRIERS OF SMOKING.
- 21 (a) In General.—Title VI of the Federal Aviation Act
- 22 of 1958 (49 U.S.C. App. 1301 et seq.; hereinafter in this Act
- 23 referred to as the "Act") is amended by adding at the end the
- 24 following:

- "SEC. 613. PROHIBITION OF SMOKING ON PASSENGER-CARRY-
- 2 ING AIRCRAFT ON DOMESTIC FLIGHTS.
- 3 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Each air carrier shall prohibit
- 4 smoking on any aircraft during any flight involving the car-
- 5 riage of passengers in interstate or overseas air transporta-
- 6 tion.
- 7 "(b) RULES AND REGULATIONS.—The Administrator
- 8 shall promulgate such rules and regulations as may be neces-
- 9 sary to carry out this section.".
- 10 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—That portion of the
- 11 table of contents of the Act which appears under the center
- 12 heading

TITLE VI-SAFETY REGULATION OF CIVIL AERONAUTICS"

13 is amended by adding at the end the following:

"Sec. 613. Prohibition of smoking on passenger-carrying aircraft on domestic flights.

"(a) In General.

"(b) Rules and Regulations.".

- 14 SEC. 4. PROHIBITION OF SMOKING.
- 15 (a) In General.—Section 902 of the Act is amended
- 16 by adding at the end the following:
- 17 "(r) Prohibition of Smoking.—It shall be unlawful
- 18 for any person to smoke on an aircraft during any flight of
- 19 the aircraft involving the carriage of passengers in interstate
- 20 or overseas air transportation.".
- 21 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—That portion of the
- 22 table of contents of the Act which relates to section 902 is
- 23 amended by adding at the end the following:

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"(r) Prohibition of smoking.".

- 1 SEC. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 2 Sections 613(a) and 902(r) of the Act (as added by this
- 3 Act) shall take effect 90 days after the date of the enactment
- 4 of this Act.
