Phone Contact with California Association of Realtors

On May 4, 1989, I called Stan Wieg of the California Association of Realtors. Stan is located in the Sacramento Office of the Association and lobbies state government on their behalf. I contacted Stan because I have known him for 10 years.

I explained that the California Restaurant Association and the California Hotel and Motel Association have been making such signs available to their members pursuant to advice they received upon their request from the California Health and Welfare Agency. I told him that, should his Association decide to recommend to its membership that such signs be posted, the tobacco manufacturers would provide the signs free of cost. I made it clear that I, on behalf of the manufacturers, was not endorsing the use of signs but would supply them if requested, using language approved by the Health and Welfare Agency for the California Restaurant Association and the California Hotel and Motel Association.

Stan told me that he would take the matter up with his chief executive officer. He said they were aware of the requirements of Proposition 65 and would get back to me if they wanted to take the manufacturers up on their offer.
