TI Program Needs

- Testimony in state and federal hearings on proposed advertising and promotional restrictions
- FAC study of advertising's impact on youth smoking with related testimony and promotion
- Support for allied groups

 - WLF
- Reprint "It's the Law" materials

ISSUE: FIRE SAFETY

- Federal consideration of legislation mandating a "fire-safe" cigarette is likely to continue
- A handful of states also are likely to consider such legislation

ADDRESSING THE ISSUE: FIRE SAFETY
