Below is my report for September, 1992.

Fair\_Taxes

I presented the Fair Tax materials and the employee privacy issue to the I.A.M. Local 2152, Canal Point, Florida which has a membership of 250. They are workers in the sugar mills who repair the machinery.

I presented the Fair Tax materials to Local 32, Sheet Metal Workers in Palm Beach. The membership was very concerned about the privacy issue and realized the importance of passing legislation to protect our workers.

I presented the Fair Tax materials and the privacy issue to the Executive Board of the A.F.W.U. local in Miami who are the Postal Workers. They have 600 members and will be allowing me to make the presentation at the next membership meeting.

The Florida State Council of Machinists and Aerospace Workers met in Pensacola, Florida on September 11-13. The Council passed the resolutions on taxes and privacy and safe indoor air quality which are enclosed.

I presented the safe indoor air quality materials to the Metro Firefighters Council which represents 2,000 members and they will allow us to make presentations to their locals.


