Dear Governor Chiles,

I am writing to encourage you to sign the law that ends discrimination against workers who use legal products "off-the-job".

I believe in freedom. I strongly believe that I should have the ability to use a legal product in the privacy of my own home without worrying about whether my employer will approve.

This bill protects individual rights. It assures that Florida citizens will have control over our personal lives. I have always believed that liberty is sacred and that government's primary responsibility should be to protect and preserve the privacy of individual citizens. This bill helps do that.

I am 62 years old. Over the course of my life I have watched as a variety of factors have contributed to the steady erosion of individual liberties. I can't just watch it happen any more. That's why I've decided to write this letter to you.

Please consider these thoughts as you decide whether to sign this bill. Many, many Americans have fought and died to protect our country's unique commitment to individual freedom. It would be a major step in the right direction to actually expand the rights of working people and average citizens rather than to allow them to be continually diminished.
