As an accomplished leader in the field of veterinary medicine, **Dr. Ann Marie Manning, V93**, was named as the 2005 recipient of the Outstanding Alumnus Award. This award honors the selected individual for the good name that he or she brings to Tufts University Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine, the veterinary profession, and their community through their distinguished accomplishments. It was presented to Ann Marie at the veterinary reunion on the Grafton Campus in September.

Since graduating from Tufts' Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine in 1993, Ann Marie has made great strides in the field of Emergency and Critical Care Services. She began with an internship in Emergency and Critical Care at Tufts from 1993-1994, and then a residency in Emergency/Critical Care at Tufts from 1994-1997. In July of 1997, Ann Marie became board certified in E/CC and joined the staff at Angell Animal Medical Center - Boston as an Emergency and Critical Care specialist. She became director of the blood bank at Angell in 1998 and the director of the emergency and critical care service in 2000. Also in 2000, Ann Marie developed a residency

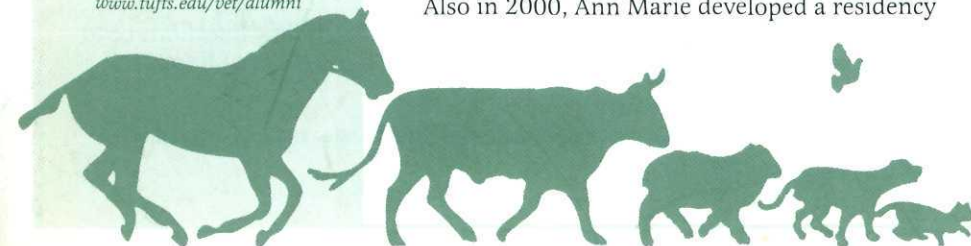

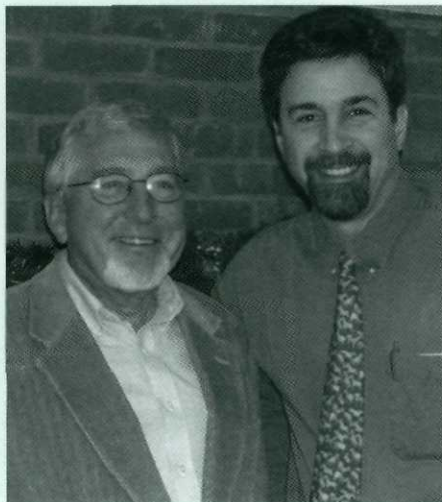
JIM ROSS GOES FISHING

A tribute by Dr. John de Jong V85

As 2005 comes to a close, Tufts University's Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine and the greater veterinary community will experience the void created by the retirement of Jim Ross, DVM, PhD, DAVVIM, DACVECC,

Is there anyone in our profession that has more degrees listed after their name? The answer is probably not. Jim started his work at Tufts in 1981 as the Acting Associate Dean for Clinical Sciences and Professor and Chair of the Department of Medicine. The school was in its infancy and throughout the past 25 years; Jim has educated all of us in the fine art and science of cardiology. It was probably during the years of work after he graduated from the Ohio State University in 1965 that he developed his broad range of mimicking the many sounds of various cardiac conditions. Those years before Tufts took him from OSU to the Baylor College of Medicine, University of Georgia, Veterans Administration Hospital, the Medical College of Ohio, Grady Veterinary Hospital, and Proctor and Gamble. We can only guess where he perfected his skills and honed them to the point where he made learning the details of the heart less complicated than one might think.

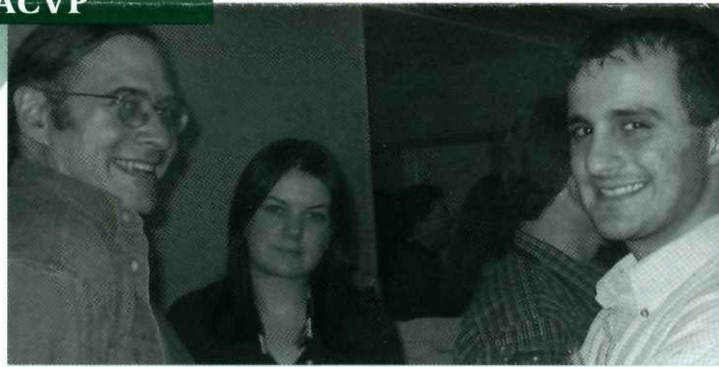

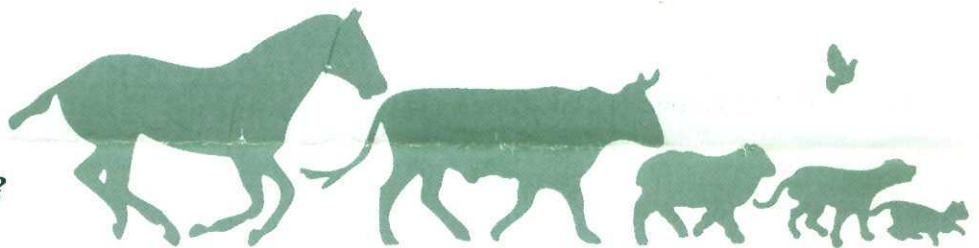
