LITTLE DAVID ... IS THE FEDERAL
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN
SERVICES ... WHICH SPENT MORE
THAN \$45 MILLION IN FISCAL YEAR
1987 ON ANTI-SMOKING ACTIVITIES
... AND HAS ANOTHER \$100
MILLION IN PROGRAMS ON THE
DRAWING BOARD.

HE ATTACKED US IN THE PRESS ... IN THE COURTS ... IN REGULATORY AGENCIES ... AND ON THE BALLOT.

AND YET ... FOR ALL OF HIS MUSCLE ... MONEY ... AND MEDIA ... HIS AIM'S NOT THAT GOOD.

GOLIATH IS STILL STANDING ...
TALL AND PROUD ... AND TOSSING
A FEW ROCKS OF HIS OWN.

WE ARE NOT A 'GOLIATH' ... BUT THEN AGAIN... THE ANTI-SMOKERS ARE NOT EXACTLY A 'DAVID.'

WHAT ARE WE?

ACCORDING TO THE NATIONAL
JOURNAL ... A PUBLICATION READ
FAITHFULLY BY WASHINGTON POLICY
MAKERS ... "THE INSTITUTE IS
CONSIDERED TENACIOUS ... SMART
... WELL FINANCED ... AND
SKILLED AT HARD-BALL."

AS WE ENTERED THIS YEAR ... OUR CHALLENGES WERE CLEAR.

O WE WERE GIVEN A 90
PERCENT CHANCE OF HIGHER
FEDERAL EXCISE TAXES ... AND
OUR ADVERSARIES WERE TRYING
TO PLACE A 250 PERCENT TAX
INCREASE ON THE BALLOT IN
CALIFORNIA.

o THE SURGEON GENERAL'S
... AND THE NATIONAL ACADEMY
OF SCIENCES' REPORTS ON ETS
... WERE STILL ON THE FRONT
PAGE AND THE EVENING NEWS.

WE EXPECTED AN ON-SLAUGHT OF SMOKING RESTRICTIONS AT ALL LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT.

O HENRY WAXMAN WAS POISED TO CONSIDER AN ADVERTISING BAN ... AND CIGARETTE INGREDIENTS ...

O THE FEDERAL FIRE SAFE
CIGARETTE STUDY WAS DUE OUT
BY YEAR'S END ... AND THERE
WAS A SERIOUS MOVE TO REMOVE
THE CIGARETTE DISCOUNT AT
MILITARY COMMISSARIES.

HOW DID WE DO?

LET ME QUOTE ONCE AGAIN FROM THE NATIONAL JOURNAL ...

"THERE IS NOT AN ORGANIZATION
IN THIS CITY, PROBABLY IN THE
COUNTRY, THAT HAS A MORE
DIFFICULT ISSUE TO WORK AND
THAT HAS BEEN ABLE TO
MAINTAIN ITSELF OVER THE PAST
15 YEARS AGAINST
UNPRECEDENTED ASSAULT."

I DISAGREE WITH THE JOURNAL ON ONE POINT. IN 1987 ... WE DID CONSIDERABLY MORE THAN "MAINTAIN" OURSELVES.

AGAINST VERY TOUGH ODDS ... WE HAD SEVERAL DECISIVE VICTORIES ... AND EXTRAORDINARY ACCOMPLISHMENTS.

OUR MOST REMARKABLE

ACCOMPLISHMENT FOR 1987 WOULD

HAVE TO BE IN THE AREA OF

TAXATION.

NOT ONLY DID WE BLOCK NEW FEDERAL EXCISES ... BUT WE ARE CLOSE TO THE POINT WHERE REGRESSIVE TAXES MAY BE OUT OF BOUNDS FOR FEDERAL LEGISLATORS.

OUR CHALLENGE IN 1988 WILL BE TO INCREASE THE PRESSURE AGAINST EXCISES AT THE FEDERAL LEVEL ... AND IN THE STATES WHERE ... THIS YEAR ... WE DEFEATED NEARLY 75 PERCENT OF THE 77 TAX BILLS PROPOSED.

OUR SECOND MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENT INVOLVES ADVERTISING RESTRICTIONS.

AT THE FEDERAL LEVEL ... ALL YEAR LONG ... THE INSTITUTE AND ITS ALLIES SUCCESSFULLY RAISED FIRST AMENDMENT ARGUMENTS ... IN HEARINGS ... AND IN THE NEWS MEDIA.

AS A RESULT ... THE
ANTI-SMOKERS SEEM TO HAVE
ABANDONED THEIR PROPOSED
ADVERTISING AND PROMOTIONAL BAN
... AND ARE NOW SEEKING OTHER
APPROACHES ... INCLUDING
'COUNTER ADVERTISING' ... AND
'CONTENT CONTROLS' ... NEXT
YEAR.

IN THE STATES ... 43
ADVERTISING AND PROMOTION BILLS
WERE INTRODUCED ... ALL BUT
THREE WERE DEFEATED OR
POSTPONED.

OF THE THREE ... JUST ONE DEALT WITH CIGARETTES, WHEN MINNESOTA BECAME THE FIRST STATE TO BAN SAMPLING. THE OTHER TWO ... INVOLVED SMOKELESS PRODUCTS.

BUT ... BY THE SAME TOKEN ...
THE MASSACHUSETTS SENATE VOTED
TO REPEAL L'OCAL SAMPLING
ORDINANCES.

OUR THIRD MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENT
WAS SUCCEEDING WITH A WIDE
VARIETY OF LESS PROMINENT ...
BUT EQUALLY IMPORTANT ISSUES
AND LEGISLATION.

THIS LIST IS LONG ... LET ME MENTION JUST THREE IMPORTANT ITEMS.

-- IN SPITE OF MUCH FANFARE
... THE ANTI-TOBACCO MOVEMENT
IN THE MILITARY HAS STALLED.

"POINT OF SALE" ANTI-SMOKING MESSAGES ... SPONSORED BY THE CANCER SOCIETY AND THE AIR FORCE ... WAS DISCONTINUED.

AND THE CIGARETTE DISCOUNT AT MILITARY COMMISSARIES IS NOT ONLY INTACT BUT ... THANKS TO SOME CLEVER LEGISLATIVE WORDING ... WILL BE EXTREMELY DIFFICULT TO ATTACK IN THE FUTURE.

-- TORT REFORM LEGISLATION WAS ADOPTED IN CALIFORNIA ... NEW JERSEY ... OHIO AND TEXAS.

AND FEDERAL RISK ASSESSMENT LEGISLATION PROGRESSED IN CONGRESS ... WITH HELPFUL LANGUAGE INSERTED BY ORGANIZED LABOR.

-- OUR RELATIONSHIP TO
AMERICA'S FIRE FIGHTERS HELPED
US DEAL WITH THE RELEASE OF THE
FEDERAL FIRE SAFE CIGARETTE
REPORT.

THIS REMAINS ONE OF OUR TOUGHEST CHALLENGES ... BUT WE ARE PREPARED FOR WHAT LIES AHEAD.

OUR FOURTH MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENT IS THE SUPPORT WE HAVE RECEIVED FROM OUR ALLIES.

WE HAVE ESTABLISHED STRONG
WORKING RELATIONSHIPS WITH
VETERANS ... RACIAL AND ETHNIC
MINORITIES ... FIRE FIGHTERS
... THE ACLU ... CHAMBERS OF
COMMERCE ... FARMERS ...
PUBLISHERS ... UNIVERSITY
ECONOMISTS ... CONVENIENCE
STORES ... WOMEN'S AND CONSUMER
GROUPS.

OUR ALLIES HAVE HELPED US WITH THE NEWS MEDIA ... AND AT ALMOST EVERY ONE OF THE 13 DAYS OF FEDERAL HEARINGS WE FACED THIS YEAR. THEY HAVE LOBBIED ON OUR BEHALF AT ALL LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT ... AND HAVE HELPED US WITH INFORMATION ... FUNDING ... AND BY CHALLENGING OUR ADVERSARIES.

IN 1987 ... FEW GROUPS HELPED US MORE THAN ORGANIZED LABOR.

CONSIDER THE EFFECT OF ADDING LABOR'S POLITICAL STRENGTH TO OUR OWN.

EIGHT OF THE TOP 25 POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEES ARE RUN BY LABOR UNIONS. TOGETHER ... LABOR'S 96 PACS RAISED MORE THAN \$61 MILLION IN THE 1985-86 ELECTION CYCLE ... ALMOST 20 PERCENT OF ALL MONEY RAISED BY PACS NATIONALLY.

IN THE HOUSE ... 200 MEMBERS
... INCLUDING NEARLY HALF OF
ALL COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN ...
VOTED WITH LABOR ON KEY ISSUES
75 PERCENT OF THE TIME OR
BETTER.

IN THE SENATE ... LABOR DOES ALMOST AS WELL.

IN 1987 ... LABOR CRITICIZED
THE SURGEON GENERAL ... TOOK
THE LEAD AGAINST EXCISES ...
AND IS OUR ONE CONSISTENT ALLY
AGAINST SMOKING RESTRICTIONS.

OUR FINAL ACCOMPLISHMENT OF THE YEAR IS THE PROGRESS WE MADE ON THE PUBLIC SMOKING ISSUE ... AGAINST THE TOUGHEST OF ODDS.

WE HAD SOME SERIOUS SETBACKS IN 1987 ... AIRLINE RESTRICTIONS IS AT THE TOP OF THE LIST.

ALMOST AS FRUSTRATING WAS THE FIGHT AGAINST LOCAL MEASURES.

ALL TOLD ... WE DEFEATED OR POSTPONED JUST ABOUT HALF OF THE 272 LOCAL ORDINANCES WE FACED THIS YEAR. SOME OF THESE RESTRICTIONS WERE FAIRLY TOUGH ... OTHERS WERE WEAKENED THROUGH GOOD LOBBYING.

50 PERCENT SIMPLY ISN'T GOOD ENOUGH.

WE FOCUS ON THE BAD NEWS ...
BUT MUCH WAS ACCOMPLISHED IN
1987 IN THIS MOST DIFFICULT
AREA.

THE PERFORMANCE AT THE STATE
LEVEL WAS EXCELLENT. OF 190
BILLS INTRODUCED IN 45 STATES
... WE DEFEATED OR POSTPONED 90
PERCENT ... AND MANAGED TO
WATER DOWN ALL BUT TWO OF THOSE
THAT PASSED.

WE HAVE TO BE PLEASED WITH THE SUCCESSFUL CHALLENGE OF THE NEW YORK PUBLIC HEALTH COUNCIL REGULATION. A LOSS WOULD HAVE HAD BROAD IMPLICATIONS.

WE DEFEATED HIGHLY VISIBLE
MEASURES IN DEL MAR AND RANCHO
MIRAGE ... AND PERSUADED THE
BEVERLY HILLS CITY COUNCIL TO
REPEAL ITS RESTAURANT BAN.

IN 1987 ... WE BEGAN TO REPOSITION THIS ISSUE ... FROM THE NARROW SUBJECT OF ETS ... TO THE BROAD ISSUE OF INDOOR AIR QUALITY.

PERHAPS THE HIGHLIGHT OF THE YEAR WAS THE COVERAGE WE RECEIVED FOR OUR "GREAT AMERICAN CHALLENGE."

THE CHALLENGE FOCUSED PUBLIC ATTENTION ON INDOOR AIR QUALITY FOR A FEW DAYS BUT ... WEEK AFTER WEEK ... GRAY ROBERTSON AND OUR OTHER SPOKESPERSONS KEPT IT ALIVE MARKET-BY-MARKET. THIS YEAR ... GRAY APPEARED ON __ TELEVISION AND RADIO PROGRAMS, AND WAS INTERVIEWED IN NEWSPAPERS IN MAGAZINES.

IN ADDITION TO GRAY ... OUR "TRUTH SQUAD" OF SCIENTISTS HAS APPEARED IN __ MARKETS, INCLUDING

I'D LIKE TO SHARE WITH YOU SOME RECENT EXAMPLES OF THEIR WORK.

OUR OVERALL PUBLIC SMOKING PROGRAM DEALS DIRECTLY WITH THE NEWS MEDIA ... BUSINESSES ... UNIONS ... ASSOCIATIONS ... PUBLIC AGENCIES AND INDIVIDUALS.

IT IS OUR MOST HEAVILY FUNDED
... MOST AGGRESSIVE AREA. EVEN
SO ... THE PUBLIC SMOKING ISSUE
IS SO LARGE ... SO PERVASIVE
... AND SO IMPORTANT ... WE
MUST DO MORE.

THIS AFTERNOON WE WILL HOLD A SPECIAL SESSION ON THIS ISSUE ... TO EXAMINE OUR STRATEGIES ... CONSIDER NEW PROGRAMS ... AND STRENGTHEN EXISTING ONES.

NEXT YEAR ... GENTLEMEN ... OUR PUBLIC SMOKING PROGRAM WILL BE OUR FIRST ... NOT OUR LAST ... ACCOMPLISHMENT.
