In this rotation student time is divided between the two disciplines of diagnostic pathology. The anatomic pathology portion of the rotation offers a "hands-on" opportunity to appreciate the concept that altered structure is the basis of altered function. In addition to being taught how to perform a postmortem examination, students are encouraged to correlate patient history, clinical signs and the clinical diagnosis with the gross and microscopic lesions and subsequently facilitate their understanding of the causes of disease and the mechanisms by which they are provoked. Tissue sampling for histologic examination is emphasized, however the sampling of tissues for cytologic, microbiological and toxicologic examination are also discussed.				

Students learn how to construct a concise gross autopsy report from postmortem findings, and have the opportunity to present selected autopsy cases at weekly Thursday afternoon pathology rounds attended by first, second and third year veterinary students in addition to hospital clinicians and/or residents involved with many of the cases submitted for autopsy.

The clinical pathology portion of the rotation uses a case-based approach to review the principles and interpretation of laboratory tests including urinalysis, CBC's, chemistry profiles, and endocrinology assays.. Students are given the opportunity to practice techniques such as microscopic examination of blood smears and urine sediment. They are introduced to the underlying principles of hematology and chemistry instrumentation and factors that can affect test results.

Students meet at 8:00 AM in the pathology conference room. Mornings are devoted to discussion of clinical pathology case material. Afternoons are spent in anatomical pathology. The only dress code requirements for the clinical pathology section is that open-toed shoes and shorts are not allowed, Scrubs or coveralls and boots are required for postmortem examination activities. Students will be on-call for autopsies on weekends and holidays on a rotating basis, but are not considered "essential" in the event of weather related campus closings.
