# Class of 2004 welcomed with refurbished campus

While the phrase “the best and brightest ever” could probably be heard in any university president’s matriculation speech, it’s a cliché that fits when describing the 1,185 freshmen that are unpacking their belongings and moving onto campus for the first time this morning. While most of the class of 2004 moves in today, many have already been on campus for several days, including those who came early for athletics, international orientation, and wilderness orientation.

The statistics on this year’s freshmen class show that it lives up to the “best and the brightest” billing. Forty eight percent of enrolling students were ranked in the top five of their high school class, while the average class rank was in the ninth percentile. The middle 50 percent of enrolling students had an SAT verbal range of 610-700 and a math range of 630-720, signifying a 45 point aggregate SAT score increase in the last seven years.

The class of 2004 boasts the most competitive acceptance rate in University history, with 25 percent of the applicant pool admitted, down seven percent from last year. This is largely due to an increase in the

number of students applying to Tufts, with a record 14,200 in last year’s pool. That means that the University has an increased opportunity to work with highly talented and diverse applicants when putting together a freshman class, according to Dean of Admissions David Cuttino.

As a result, “The University is more consistently sharing with other leading universities’ offers of admissions to applicants. [And] despite greater competition to enroll some of the most talented students in the world, the percentage of students accepting the offer of admission [at Tufts] has increased by four percent in the last three years,” Cuttino said.

However they were selected, the freshmen seem excited to get their college careers started – and some are already looking forward to their first study break. “I heard that it was a really good academic place and a good party school, so I’m waiting for that,” said freshman Tanya Santos, who hails from the Phillipines and was here early for International Orientation.

Despite their record-breaking numbers, the class of 2004 bears striking similarities to previous classes. Their hopes and goals for the next four years look much like those of their predecessors, espe-

cially when it comes to those all-important “quality-of-life” concerns.

“Where are all the girls in this dorm,” one freshman called to a newfound friend walking through his dorm. “All I’ve seen since I’ve gotten here are guys.”

Aside from its coeducational residence halls, Tufts’ attractiveness can be attributed to a number of developments over the past several years. While Tufts’ proximity to Boston has always been a selling point, the University has also taken steps to improve and expand the main Medford/Somerville campus. This year’s matriculation will mark the long-awaited debut of Dowling Hall, and last year saw the opening of the cavernous Gantcher Convocation Center. Also, construction of a new Psychology building began at the end of the summer, and plans for a new state-of-the-art music building are being discussed, though the administration has encountered resistance from the Zeta Psi fraternity, whose house would be knocked down to make room for the new facility.

Besides “talented,” “diverse” may be the word that best describes the new freshman class. The class of 2004 is one of the most racially diverse classes in Tufts history. Eight percent of enrolling students

classify themselves as African American, up from three percent in 1993. Nine percent of the class is Hispanic, while 15 percent are of Asian descent.

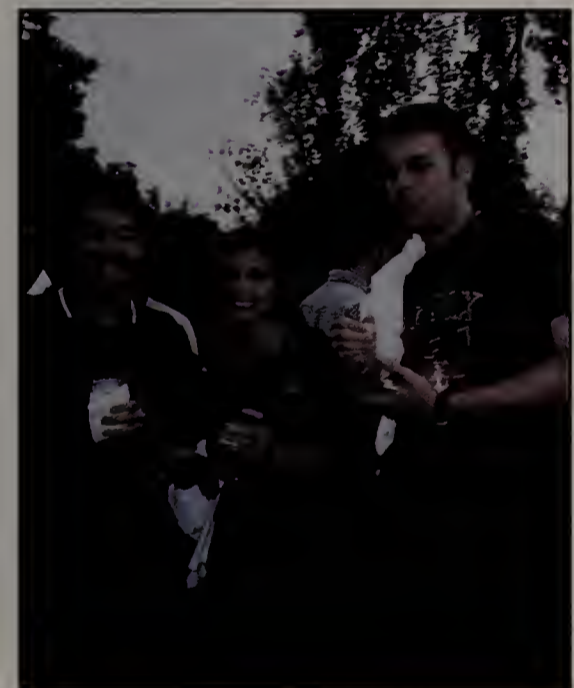
The importance Tufts places on attracting a diverse student body has been evident to students who arrived early to campus this year. “I was surprised to see how much pride the University takes in its diversity,” said freshman Oni Brown. “I applied to some schools where it seems like they only take minorities because they need it for numbers. Here they really seem to care about it.”

The class of 2004 also hails from a variety of different ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. Students are matriculating from over 40 different countries, and 13 percent of freshmen are foreign citizens or US citizens living abroad.

The most commonly represented foreign countries are China, the United Kingdom, Turkey, Canada, Greece, and Japan. Even within the US, freshmen are spread evenly over the country’s socio-economic area, with 31 percent coming from small towns, 29 percent from medium sized cities and environs, 16 percent from large cities, and 31 percent from the suburbs of large cities.

# JUMBO LOVE

## We are the Tufts Jumbos

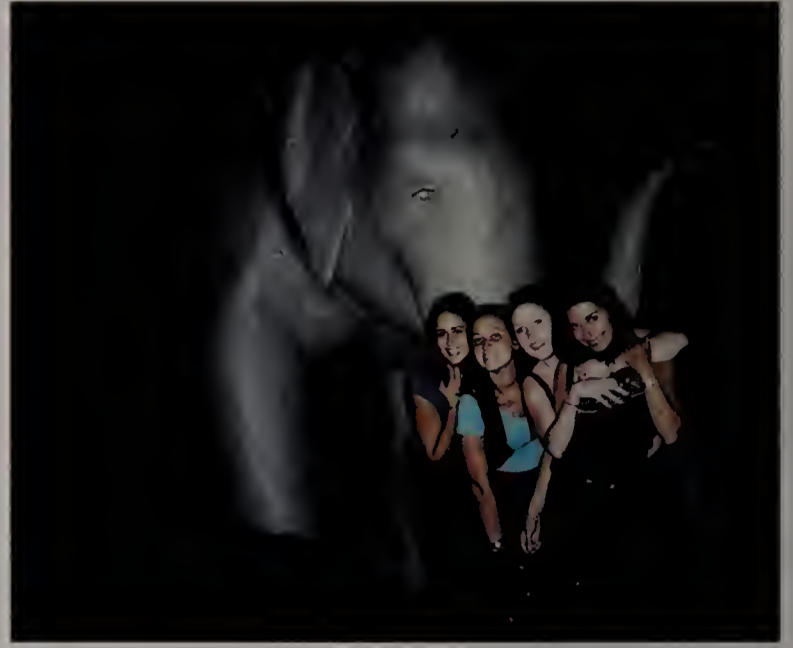
“Is this school obsessed with elephants or something?” a prospective student once asked me on a tour. Well, yes, in a sense we are. We may be used to the sight of them by now, but to the rest of the world Tufts seems to be obsessed with elephants: they adorn our buildings, a cement elephant stands in our academic quad, and the word “jumbos” appears on t-shirts, sweatshirts, and even girls’ bottoms.

Our school’s “obsession” with all things pachyderm began with one of our founding trustees—P.T. Barnum, of the Barnum and Bailey Circus. At the time, the star of the Barnum & Bailey Circus was this gigantic elephant named Jumbo, which came from Swahili word “jumbe” for Chief. The legend of Jumbo is that it died while saving another elephant from getting hit by an oncoming train. Back then, the circus used to travel by train and when Jumbo saw that a baby elephant was still on the tracks, Jumbo pushed it aside, and sadly got hit by the train.

Barnum, grief-stricken that his prize elephant was killed, had Jumbo stuffed in what was considered the world’s largest taxidermy project and was placed in Tufts’ very own Barnum Hall, which was constructed around the giant beast. There, Jumbo stood for many years as sort of a historic symbol of the circus and of Tufts. Many students would visit Jumbo to put pennies in its trunk for good luck.

Disaster struck Jumbo once again in 1976 when a huge fire burned Barnum Hall – and Jumbo along with it – to the ground. According to the legend, only the tail and ashes of Jumbo survived the fire. The tail supposedly resides in Barnum Hall today, wrapped carefully in a box, a sacred piece of our beloved mascot. And the ashes were scooped up and put in a peanut butter jar and are handed from athletic director to athletic director and are kept in the Athletics Office. A smaller replica of Jumbo (Jumbo II as some call it) now stands in front of the rebuilt Barnum Hall. Students today continue to flick pennies onto Jumbo’s trunk for good luck on final exams.

While I contend that the elephant is, for sure, an odd mascot, I reassure prospective students that if they do come to Tufts, they will not help but have an affinity for elephants. I don’t know anyone who doesn’t own an elephant stuffed animal or a Jumbos sweatshirt. So, when I’m asked, “what’s with all the elephants?” it’s easy for me to proudly answer: “We are the Tufts Jumbos.”

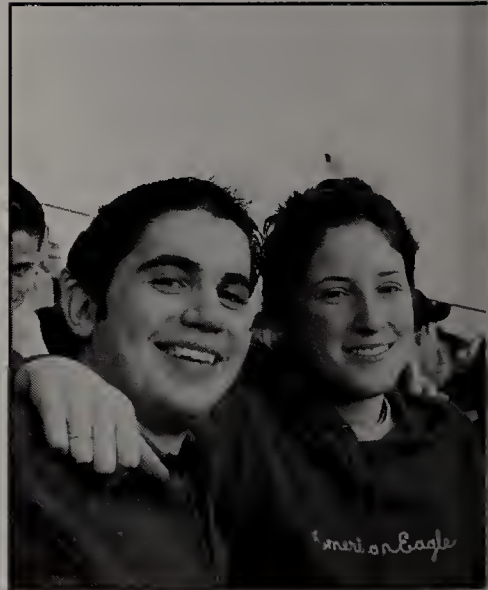

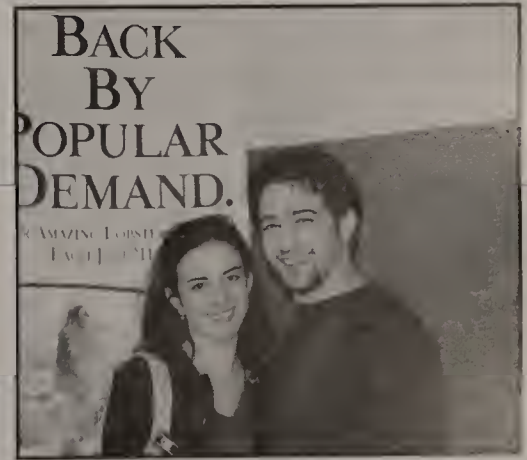

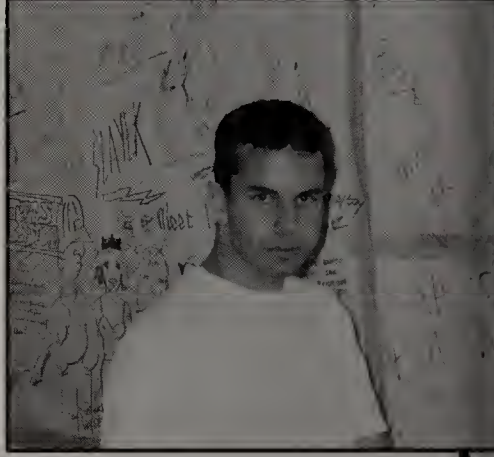

# Leonard Carmichael Society (LCS)



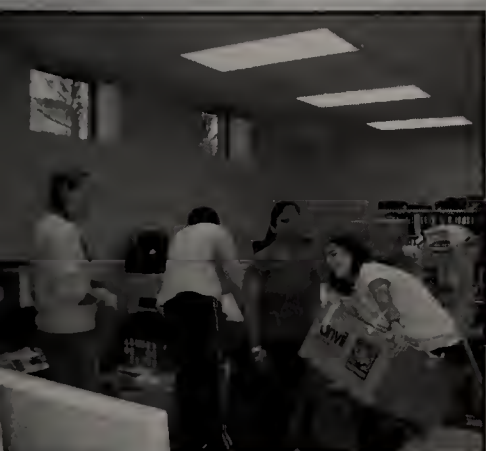

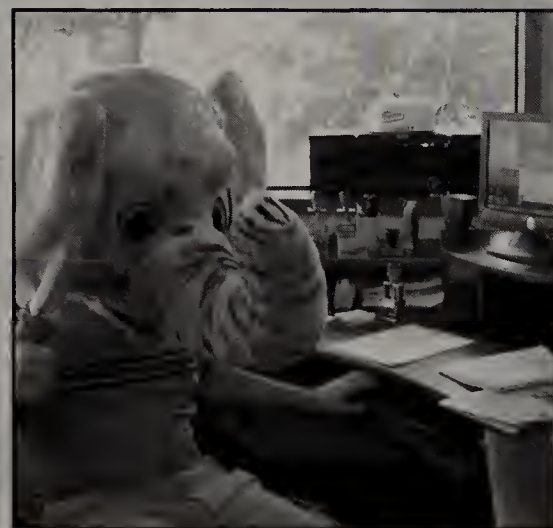

TDC is a student-run, extracurricular, modern dance group open to students of all levels and experience. TDC also sponsors dance workshops, as well as fall and spring concerts. Tufts Dance Collective Shares Love of Dance with All, by Melissa Laudano One of the many opportunities for performance at Tufts is the Tufts Dance Collective (TDC), a non-audition student-run performance group that allows students with different levels of dance experience to get involved. At the beginning of the semester TDC sponsors an informational meeting open to any students interested in participating where the student choreographers give an overview of their dances and the practice time involved. Students will typically rehearse an hour per week throughout the semester for each dance they have selected. The fruits of this labor are displayed in two performances each year. The TDC shows, held at the end of each semester in Cohen Auditorium, showcase about twenty student choreographed dance routines and often feature guest performers such as TURBO (Tufts' break dancing organization) and Tufts' Bhangra troop. The TDC performances includes hip-hop, tap, modern, and jazz dances. The Fall 2001 semester show had audience members dancing in their seats to songs like "Busta Move" by Young MC, "Naked Eye" by Luscious Jackson, and "Devil Went Down to Georgia" by the Charlie Daniels Band. The variety of styles allows students to explore many different types of dance, but they all do have one thing in common - they are filled with explosive energy. The Tufts Dance Collective always presents shows that reflects its members' love of dancing. In addition to their performances, the Tufts Dance Collective also offers an annual "master class" taught by a professional dancer. This class too is open to anyone in the Tufts community who is interested. Through this class and through the non-audition dance performances, the Tufts Dance Collective fulfills its mission of providing a forum for all to learn more about dance and serves as an outlet to meet new people who share an interested in this art.

Cheap Sox, Tufts' improvisational comedy troupe, offers a show of spontaneous delight and audience participation. Taking suggestions from the audience, the troupe weaves a series of unpredictable scenes, stunts, and buffoonery that has ranged from Pet Shop Cuisine to a baby nursery on the Starship Enterprise. The troupe regularly performs on campus and participates annually in the Skidmore National Comedy Festival.

Created in 1993 as a "means of cultural expression through singing acting and dancing", Spirit of Color (aka: SoC) has become one of Tuft's most popular performing arts troupes. Now strictly a dance group (although our between-dance skits have had their moments), our shows primarily feature hip-hop, jazz and ethnic (recently latin, indian, african, hawaiian and filipino tinikling) dance styles but have also included stepping, tap, ballet/lyrical, bboying and techno/glowstick dancing. We routinely sell out our end-of-semester shows in the 600+ seat Cohen Auditorium at the Aidekman Arts Center, located downhill on Talbot Ave., and are known for always having a loud, active and VERY enthusiastic audience.
