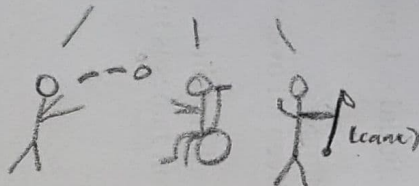

It's time to for Jumuah!

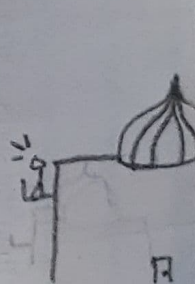

Baba!

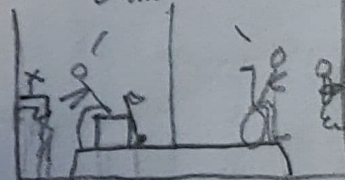


text/

Like Harris,

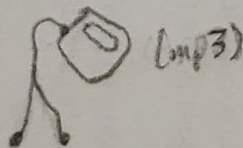
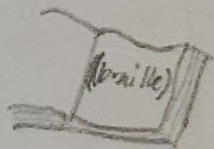

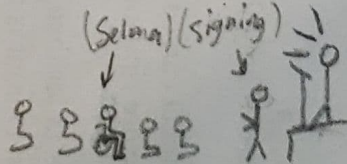

audio: Before the khutba (sermon) starts, Harris and Adam read or listen to the Qur'an as they wait for the service to start.

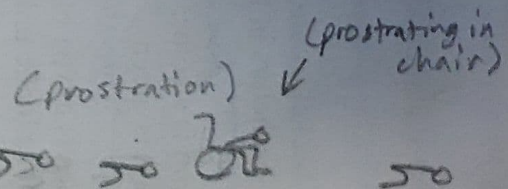
Pg 5
