Report about the role the Prosecutor

on Criminal Procedure in the Conflict of Darfur

The affinities of the Prosecutor covers most of Localities in South Darfur State through the active existence of representative of prosecutor according Criminal Law Procedures for 1991, where the Prosecutor takes legal action in criminal suits,

- supervises the investigation,
- renews arrest warrants,
- refers cases to the court,
- and take the responsibility of proceeding authority in crimes against state of community,.

- And also investigate in crime according to the Law of Investigation Committees for the year 1954.
- The Prosecutors perform their duties on neutral basis

Office of Prosecutor

- On carrying out its duties, the Office of Prosecutor formed out through legal reports and Investigations that most of conflicts were about land and farms,
 - i.e. between farmers and nomads.
- Some of these conflicts have many victims, but eventually these conflicts have been settled according to the local conventions and traditions in Darfur all through a number of tribal reconciliation conferences.

The Attorney General's Office

• The Attorney General's Office has also investigates in many cases e.g.: rape cases, armed robbery and killing of people, and transferred them court which are specially established for cases.

• Some of the criminals were sentenced to deathly hanging. Examples of these are Singita and Halluf cases. Some of cases have been referred to prosecutor Darfur crimes for farther investigation.

- We would like to point out that some of criminals were members of Armed Movements (the Rebels) and the rebels normally don't cooperate in arresting the criminals. An example thise is T
