Report on Workplace Smoking

While in the past, <u>USA Today</u> and the Bureau of National Affairs (BNA) have been tough on our industry, two new articles have recently been published which present a more balanced viewpoint.

USA Today's editorial on November 7, states that stopping public smoking entirely is unrealistic. While we certainly do not endorse the whole editorial, overall, it is a more balanced opinion than past anti-tobacco diatribes.

In contrast to the BNA's critical report in 1987, a new report released October 23, is even handed. The Tobacco Institute is quoted numerous times on how to balance smokers' rights in the workplace.

There is also a strong labor influence in the piece. The first statement in the Analysis Section states; "U.S. labor unions continue to hold to the position that the best workplace smoking policies are ones that are negotiated." This is due in large part by work done by the industry's Labor Management Committee.
