Only the authors of those articles selected for publication are revealed. Deadlines for submission in this section are January 15 for the summer issue, and September 15 for the winter issue. Details regarding selection of book reviews and articles solicited for the special feature sections are available from the editors in charge. The Forum will not publish any submission which has already been published or is scheduled for publication in the United States. Footnotes must conform to the Chicago Manual of Style or the 13th edition of the Uniform Legal System of Citation for legal articles. The Forum assumes no responsibility for manuscripts, or disks or other materials submitted. Items submitted for consideration should be accompanied by a stamped envelope if their return is desired.
