1985 YEAR-END SUMMARY
LOCAL SMOKING RESTRICTION LEGISLATION

In 1985, 204 cities and towns considered legislation to restrict smoking in various places, including workplaces, restaurants and other places open to the public. Ordinances were adopted by 108 of these localities, rejected by 56 and carried over to 1986 consideration in 50. (Some localities considered more than one proposal.)

This Special Report divides this activity into **Approved, Defeated** and **Pending**, listing localities alphabetically by state within those categories. Where measures included workplace or restaurant provisions, the locality is followed by **W** or **R**. Voluntary programs approved by legislative or regulatory bodies are noted by **vol.** Legislation amending existing law to make restrictions tougher is noted by **amd.** Localities without any designation considered public places restrictions. At the end is a short section on legislation to weaken or repeal restriction laws.
