On behalf of our respective members, we have conducted a thorough analysis of the proposed 25-cents-per-tax tax increase on cigarettes in Massachusetts. That analysis is contained in the attached, "Impact of Massachusetts Cigarette Tax."

It is our belief that, if adopted, this tax would spur large-scale cross-border sales, and, perhaps more significantly, lead to the development of organized smuggling distribution networks as we have seen through well-documented investigations in Michigan and elsewhere.

Should you have any questions, we will be pleased to provide expert testimony by criminologists, or refer you to law enforcement officials our colleagues have worked with across the country, including the BATF, U.S. Customs, as well as state investigators and revenue departments in various states.
