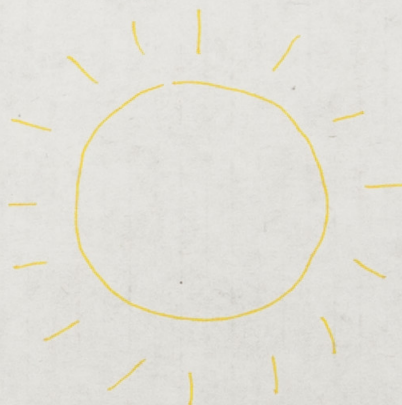
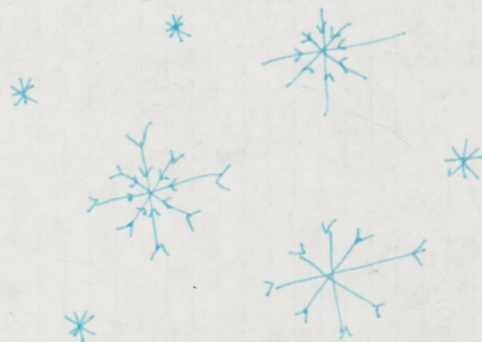


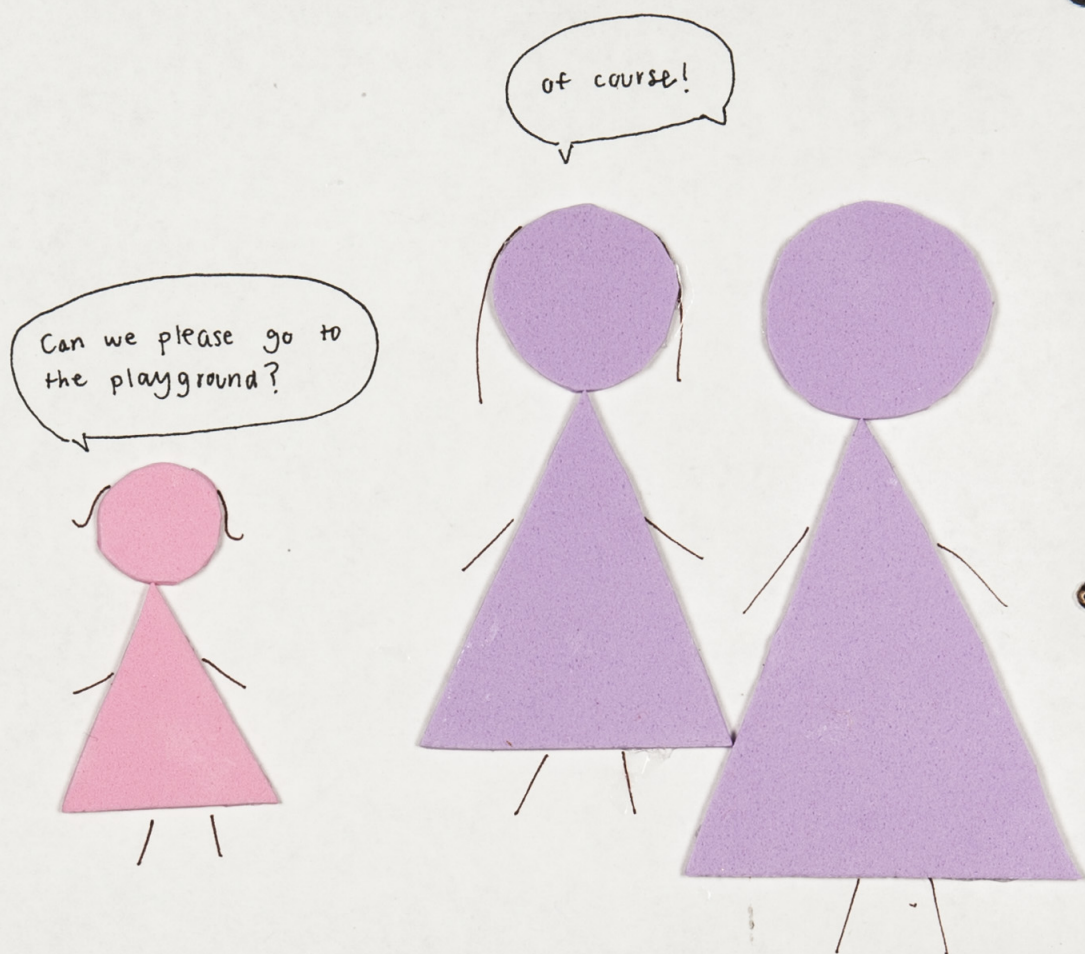
Abby's Adventure

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One day, Abby asks her parents if they can go to the playground. They agree, so off they go!

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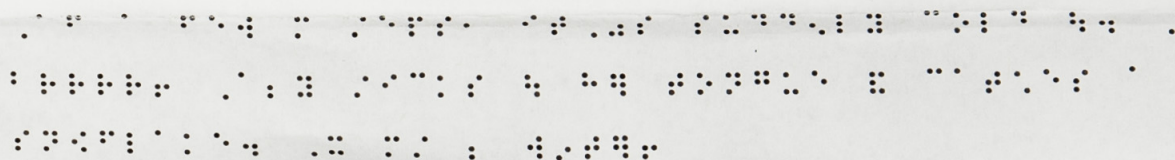


As soon as Abby steps outside her house, she hears crunching leaves beneath her feet. It must be fall!

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Smell the flowers!





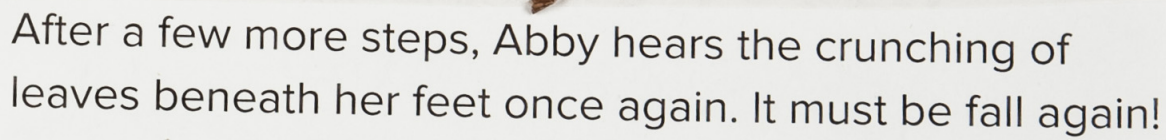

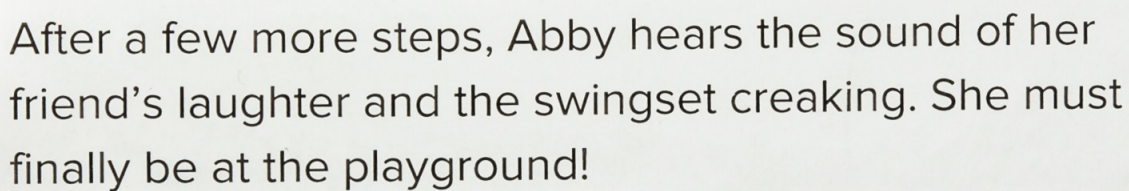
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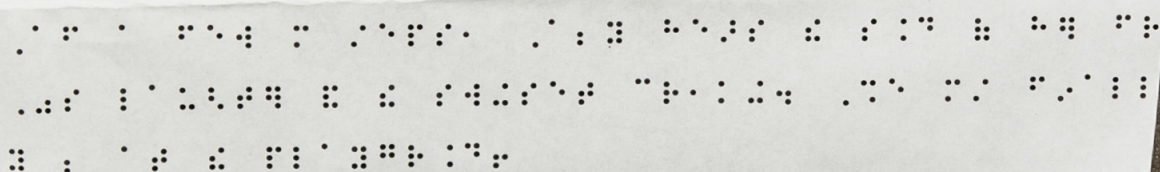
Touch the sand!
