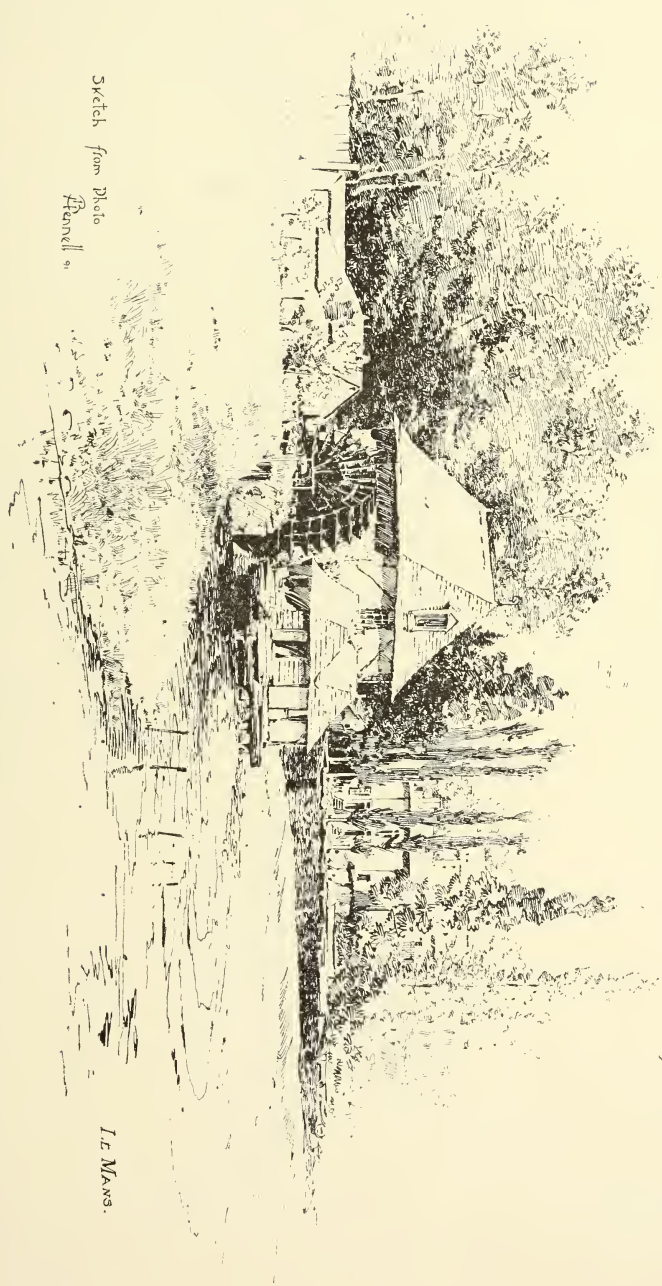


VESTIBULE OF HOTEL DE BEAUVAIS, PARIS.
