GFA: The song says what? "Klala me madə" which means, "I will sleep in the calico cloth." The drum says, "Zə miyi afe gbə." Simple as this: If you are on the battlefield and you die, they will put you in a white calico cloth, tie you up, and take you home, which is "afe gbə." That is why I say on the drum, "Zə miyi afe gbə," "You should walk back home with the dead body of the warrior who has been killed in the desert." That is the reason why I put those two together. I also say, "Kaba kaba," "Quickly quickly." You should rush him back home. Those are the only two patterns in that. "Hlebe hlebe" is "Kaba kaba."

DL: I am going to ask you to sing the drum language.

GFA: "Hlebe hlebe dzadzin dza dzidzin" [plays on legs]. That stands for "Kaba kaba zə míyi afe gbə."
