## Labor Consultant Report

The following is a report of my activities on behalf of the Labor Management Committee (LMC) in Region II during the month of July. All of the stated activities, expenses and suggestions have been pre-approved or discussed with either the Tobacco Institute Regional Vice President or other representative of the LMC.

### Overview

During July the LMC's interest in expansion of substantive union support for IAQ positions was advanced. Our current focus is on bringing our past success with Central Labor Councils and individual unions to the state level. In this effort we have succeeded. It is likely this will lead to legislative support in 1991.

### Detail of Activity

Discussions with Ed Cleary, President, Ed Connelly and Ed Wilcox, legislative agents, have resulted in an agreement to place two resolutions on the August Convention agenda -- an IAQ resolution (see A-1) and an anti-discrimination resolution (see A-2). It is also possible that a resolution opposing advertising bans will be considered (see A-3). It is unlikely, given the current state of union politics in New York, that the issue of taxes could be seriously addressed this year.


In this context the state federation has offered Tom Donohue, Jr. and myself use of state federation hotel rooms at the convention (at no cost to the LMC). The federation is also attempting to provide the LMC with time on the agenda. This will be worked out in August.

Future Plans

- \* The LMC will participate in the 8/26-30 New York State Convention.
- \* Request Tom Donohue attend.
- \* Request approval of text of attached resolutions for use in New York.
- \* Continue efforts to spur AFL-CIO to introduce legislation to address IAQ issues; support a non-tobacco industry linked anti-discrimination bill if appropriate. Develop an advertising ban position.

Recommendations

- \* I believe there is a need to take note of a plan to work with the efforts to Trish Gunning at the AFL-CIO. The work of that office with state federation legislative directors is likely to be helpful in the future.
