LEE PHILLIP HOSTING: SMOKING

PHILLIP: Let me ask you both this, because you're leading up to it. Do you feel that people's rights are violated when they go for a job at Westlake Hospital or Hinsdale where they do not hire people that smoke. Doctor, you feel...

DR. WILLARD FRY (Illinois Council on Smoking and Disease): I think they're making an intelligent choice to request people not to smoke. They don't have to apply for a job there. They can go someplace else and work. Johns Manville, for example, will not allow smoking in its asbestos plant up in Waukegan because of the health risks of smoking and asbestos exposure.

PHILLIP: All right. Mr. Schiller?

JAY SCHILLER (Acty., Pro-Smokers' Rights): Well, of course then the next step is that I'm not going to be allowed to smoke in my office. I'm not going to be allowed to smoke in the corridors of the court building. I'm not going to be allowed to smoke while I'm in the waiting room of a hospital wondering what's going on to a friend or a relative in another part of the hospital. And a cigar, although of course it's not a necessity, it's really a very, very relaxing... Well, if you want to call it a habit or whatever, I think it's helpful.

PHILLIP: So you feel that people whether they smoke or not smoke should be able to apply anywhere for a job. Is that right?

SCHILLER: Oh, of course, of course. So then they'll make restrictions of all kinds and all places. There are many more nonsmokers than smokers.

PHILLIP: But then we just heard what Dr. Fry said, that it could be dangerous to nonsmokers. Are you in favor, Mr. Schiller, of having restricted areas to smoke?

SCHILLER: Oh, absolutely, absolutely.

PHILLIP: At a job.

SCHILLER: Oh, sure. At a job, and in certain public places.

PHILLIP: Restaurants.

SCHILLER: But life isn't easy, and some people have to put up sometimes with some unpleasantness, and if smoke
