This 3-week rotation prepares the student to correctly interpret and produce radiographs of large and small animals. Students will have the chance to further improve their ultrasound skills and to appreciate the role of advanced imaging techniques such as nuclear medicine, CT and MRI in a referral-level practice. The student will rotate through the different areas of the diagnostic imaging section and under the supervision of the radiology technical staff, will take radiographs of the daily clinical cases presented to the hospitals and assist with ultrasound and nuclear medicine studies. The student will also provide unsupervised weekend and after-hours weekday coverage of the small animal radiology caseload. This course, which consists of lectures and systematic dissection of the horse and a ruminant species (usually a calf or a goat), is designed to gain a comprehensive knowledge of the macroscopic anatomy of the equine and ruminant species. Clinically important anatomical differences in the Llama and the pig are also presented. The course also includes comparative anatomy of the head region of carnivores and herbivores, including the cranial nerves and the CNS.

The objectives of the course are to understand the basic and clinical anatomy of all regions of the body, including the visceral organs of the domesticated ungulates. Innervation and blood supply to organs are stressed where they are clinically important. Major differences in equine versus the ruminant musculoskeletal system and visceral organs are discussed in relation to functional adaptation of these species. Clinically relevant and species-specific anatomical differences in the pig and llama are emphasized in lecture and laboratory sessions, in addition to addressing structural and clinical importance. The large animal component of the course requires active student participation in teaching each other.

Prerequisite: A sound knowledge of basic anatomy of the carnivores is essential in order to appreciate the similarities and differences in large animals. The student is expected to review comparable canine anatomy before attending each large animal gross anatomy lecture and laboratory session.

The object of the histology course is to help students understand the microanatomy of cell, tissues, and organs and to correlate structure with function. Lectures and laboratories will emphasize normal cell and tissue morphology as viewed with the light microscope, however when appropriate, transmission and scanning electron microscopic images in addition to cytology will be employed. Occasional examples of disease processes will be mentioned to enhance understanding of normal structure and function. Laboratory sessions will be set up as facilitator-guided small groups sessions. Attendance is required and students are expected to prepare ahead of time for each session so that they can answer questions posed by their facilitator. The course uses virtual microscopy, which is a method of viewing a digitized microscope specimen on a computer screen. Students can access the virtual slides (WebSlide[®] Virtual Microscopy) at home or on campus using a laptop or desktop computer.
