<p>This course introduces students to the pathophysiology of diseases that occur in the urinary system of domestic animals, including congenital anomalies, infectious diseases, nephrotoxins, immune mediated diseases and urinary tract neoplasms. The effect of these changes on other body systems is also discussed. Basic normal anatomy and physiology are reviewed as necessary to enhance the student's understanding of pathophysiologic processes. Laboratory techniques for assessment of function and disease of the urinary tract and drugs used to treat diseases of the urinary tract are also introduced. The course includes a urinalysis wet laboratory and case presentations that help students integrate and assimilate lecture materials.</p>

Many dogs with splenic mass lesions--particularly those with splenic hemangiosarcoma--have a poor long term prognosis, and a better understanding of the clinical parameters that may predict survival to discharge will enable us to better advise owners considering surgery and hospitalization for their dogs. We have identified approximately 1,100 dogs that have undergone splenectomy for splenic masses during the past several years. We need to assemble a team of about four to five selective students to review the patients' records in FIRST (the hospital's electronic medical records system) and gather clinical data on the patients. The data will then be analyzed statistically at the end of the semester. This selective will give students an opportunity to learn about the design of a large clinical retrospective study, to gain an understanding of the clinical issues surrounding the management of patients with splenic masses, and to participate in data collection for a research project. In the first half of the course, presentations from experts in the field cover regulatory control of research animal use, the role of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee, animal models in biomedical research, and ethical use of animals. A laboratory animal anatomy module includes three dissection labs devoted to anatomy of rodents, lagomorphs, hamsters, ferrets, and gerbils. The second half of the course is focused on care of research animals and design of research animal facilities. The class will tour a barrier rodent housing facility, a rodent facility using robotic technology, and a primate facility. Students are expected to attend all classes, labs, and tours. They will be required to write one analysis paper on research animal ethical cases and to work in groups to create a design for a multi-species research animal facility. Medicine lectures utilize a problem-oriented approach using case examples for diseases. The surgical lectures provide students with guidance on the didactic aspects of surgical diseases of large animals. The course is team taught by the large animal hospital and ambulatory faculty. It is supplemented by guest lecturers who present information on beef and swine production, viewed from the perspective of the animal industry. <p>The Pet Loss Hotline (PLH(Pet Loss Hotline)) provides grieving owners with an opportunity to discuss the loss of their pet with concerned and compassionate veterinary students. The PLH(Pet Loss Hotline) is part of the Animals in Community track of the Center for Animals and Public Policy at the Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine. As PLH(Pet Loss Hotline) volunteers, veterinary students will obtain experience in supporting owners who have experienced the loss of a pet. The overall goal is for students to put this experience to use during their clinical training and veterinary practice. An experienced counselor will provide training in hotline work. Training includes developing skills for listening and communication, as well as recognizing and dealing with crises. Training sessions will be held on the Grafton Campus, and will be augmented by monthly debriefing meetings with a counselor and faculty advisors to discuss issues (including feelings) that may have arisen during hotline work. Twenty four-hour emergency consultation will be provided as a backup to participants by faculty advisors and counselors as needed. Students <i>must</i> attend the mandatory training sessions and monthly debriefing meetings. Student volunteers will be scheduled to work evening PLH(Pet Loss Hotline) shifts during which they will take incoming calls and respond to hotline voice-mail messages. In addition, each semester, students will be required to write a one page case summary of a PLH(Pet Loss Hotline) call that they received, to be submitted to faculty advisors for critique. The aim of this case summary is to encourage the student volunteer to think about the call that they received and how they handled it, as well as to receive feedback from the faculty advisors. Students participating in one semester plus summer break, or two semesters, will receive one credit. Those who participate in one full year (sequential fall, spring, and summer selective blocks) of hotline support will obtain two full credits. In order for the hotline to be adequately staffed, preference may be given to those students attempting a two credit selective. The Pet Loss Hotline has been functioning since 1996. The faculty advisors and student volunteers are very excited about the growth in popularity of the hotline and the opportunity that it provides us with to help people, who have lost a pet, in their time of need. We constantly receive letters and cards from pet owners around the country thanking us for our work. In addition, press releases have unanimously applauded what they see as our vital role in the support of grieving pet owners. The benefits go far beyond a warm, fuzzy feeling. Students find that the training sessions improve their listening and counseling skills as well as communication skills. If you don't know what to say someone if their animal dies, if you can't imagine how to deal with people crying after their animal is euthanized, and if you want to make a real difference, sign up for this selective.</p> <p>h5. Large animal medicine and surgery are taught together to facilitate the learning of the problems and treatments of large animal species. Diseases are discussed by systems within the species affected. The approximate proportion of lectures per species is as follows: equine - 35%, bovine - 35%, small ruminants and llamas - 15% and swine - 10%. Medicine lectures utilize a problem-oriented approach using case examples for diseases. The surgical lectures provide students with guidance on the didactic aspects of surgical diseases of large animals. The course is team taught by the large animal hospital and ambulatory faculty. It is supplemented by guest lecturers who present information on beef and swine production, viewed from the perspective of the animal industry. The course builds on previous courses in the basic sciences on pathophysiology and clinical pathology.

Recommended text for the medicine portion of the courses is Large Animal Internal Medicine, Edited by Brad Smith, 4rd edition. Sports medicine lectures can be augmented with the reference: Diagnosis and Management of Lameness in the Horse edited by MW Ross and SJ Dyson (2003). The text , 4th ed, edited by Auer and Stick is the recommended reference for the equine surgical portion of the courses.

This 3-week rotation prepares the student to correctly interpret and produce radiographs of large and small animals. Students will have the chance to further improve their ultrasound skills and to appreciate the role of advanced imaging techniques such as nuclear medicine, CT and MRI in a referral-level practice. The student will rotate through the different areas of the diagnostic imaging section and under the supervision of the radiology technical staff, will take radiographs of the daily clinical cases presented to the hospitals and assist with ultrasound and nuclear medicine studies. The student will also provide unsupervised weekend and after-hours weekday coverage of the small animal radiology caseload. Most of the technical aspects needed to produce a diagnostic radiograph in the private practice setting, including radiation safety, will be covered. Film reading exercises with the radiology faculty and residents will be held daily. In addition, there will be independent study periods of a PACS-based teaching file. Non-graded weekly exams will be given in the first two weeks with a graded case-based exam at the end of the rotation contributing 15% of your grade. The anatomic pathology portion of the rotation offers a "hands-on" opportunity to appreciate the concept that altered structure is the basis of altered function. In addition to being taught how to perform a postmortem examination, students are encouraged to correlate patient history, clinical signs and the clinical diagnosis with the gross and microscopic lesions and subsequently facilitate their understanding of the causes of disease and the mechanisms by which they are provoked. Tissue sampling for histologic examination is emphasized, however the sampling of tissues for cytologic, microbiological and toxicologic examination are also discussed. Students learn how to construct a concise gross autopsy report from postmortem findings, and have the opportunity to present selected autopsy cases at weekly Thursday afternoon pathology rounds attended by first, second and third year veterinary students in addition to hospital clinicians and/or residents involved with many of the cases submitted for autopsy.</p> <p>The clinical pathology portion of the rotation uses a case-based approach to review the principles and interpretation of laboratory tests including urinalysis, CBC's, chemistry profiles, and endocrinology assays.. Students are given the opportunity to practice techniques such as microscopic examination of blood smears and urine sediment. They are introduced to the underlying principles of hematology and chemistry instrumentation and factors that can affect test results.</p> <p>Students meet at 8:00 AM in the pathology conference room. The first half of the course focuses on the basic concepts in innate and adaptive immune mechanisms. The functions of antigen-specific cells of the adaptive immunity, T and B lymphocytes, are discussed in particular, as well as the unique features of antigen-specific receptors of the lymphocytes, such as, how antigen-specific lymphocytes recognize antigens, and how the lymphocytes help in elimination of pathogens from the body. The importance of cytokines of innate and adaptive immunity in health and disease is also covered. In the second half of the course, the basic concepts learned in the first half are applied to the practical aspects of transplantation and immunization, as well as to clinical problems, resulting either from defects in the immune system (immunodeficiency) or as a consequence of immune responses (hypersensitivity and autoimmunity).</p>
