PRELIMINARY NOTE

The Pan American Union publishes at regular intervals a pamphlet showing the "Status of the Pan American Treaties and Conventions". The purpose of the present volume is to provide more complete information on these agreements.

The Pan American Union is not the depository of the instruments of ratification of conventions signed at the Inter-American Radio Congresses or the Postal Congresses, and consequently it has been difficult to obtain authoritative data regarding their status. For that reason they have been omitted.

Following the chart for each treaty, footnotes indicate the location of the original instrument and of the instruments of ratification, and call attention to the countries that have made reservations. Each agreement is also correlated with others on the same subject. A number of agreements have been replaced by more recent ones.

The same classification is followed here that is used in the periodical pamphlet mentioned above. Section "A" includes the treaties and conventions signed at the International Conferences of American States, including the tenth at Caracas under the new name, "The Inter-American Conference". Section "B" includes treaties and conventions signed at Special Conferences, and Section "C" those opened for signature at the Pan American Union. This arrangement will make it easier to refer to both publications simultaneously, and to find in the present volume the agreements that are cited in relation with others.

The Treaty of Arbitration for Pecuniary Claims came into effect on February 10, 1905, when the fifth ratification of the Treaty was deposited, and it continued in force for the period of five years beginning on the date above mentioned. Subsequently it was extended, with the exception of Article 3, until December 31, 1912, by the Convention of Rio de Janeiro, 1906 (A-11), being superseded by the Convention of Buenos Aires, 1910 (A-17).
