SURVEY FINDS SERIOUS AND WIDESPREAD INDOOR AIR QUALITY PROBLEMS IN GOVERNMENT OFFICE BUILDINGS

Government workers face an increasing health threat from poor indoor air quality in their office buildings according to a comprehensive survey conducted by the Safe Workplace Air Coalition. Widespread symptoms of poor indoor air quality were discovered among the 1,000 government workers surveyed. The American Federation of Government Employees (AFGE) District 14 and the National Energy Management Institute (NEMI) formed the Safe Workplace Air Coalition and commissioned the survey to document the extent of the indoor air quality problem in federal and District offices.
