Dear TAN Member:

As you may have read in the newspaper or heard on the local news, four members of the Los Angeles City Council are pushing for adoption of an ordinance which would restrict smoking in the office workplace. This measure would be similiar in most respects to the recently enacted San Francisco ordinance.

The ordinance is not yet drafted, but will be considered first by the Public Health, Human Resources and Senior Citizen's Committee. There will probably be hearings in August.

We believe this is another outrageous governmental intrusion into the personal lives of all citizens.

If you feel as we do that the proposed ordinance is unnecessary, unfair and unwanted, I urge you to:

1. Write to or call your city councilman in opposition to an additional unnecessary law which would regulate smoking in the workplace. When you write, send a copy of your letter to Mayor Tom Bradley.
2. Urge your fellow employees, acquaintances, business contacts and friends, to do the same.

I have enclosed a list of the members of the Los Angeles City Council. If you are not sure who your councilman is, call 485-2121, ask for the city clerk's office, state your home address and ask for the name of your city councilman.

Remember, no matter where you live in Los Angeles you can also write or call Mayor Tom Bradley.

Also enclosed are some suggested points to make in your letter or call.

It is important that we respond to this issue immediately.
